Partnership with VGCC and NC A&T

Application Deadline: March 31st, 2025

Mission Statement

The RIBN program supports the mission of the North Carolina Community College System and the mission of Vance-Granville Community College (VGCC). The faculty is committed to providing accessible high-quality nursing education to meet the diverse and changing healthcare needs of the service area and to promoting the development of qualified students prepared for the professional role of registered nurse at the entry level. Students in this program are dually enrolled at VGCC and North Carolina A&T State University for a total of four years. Upon completion of Year 3, the student graduates with an Associate Degree in Nursing and meets the education requirements to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®). Students will then continue in classes at NC A&T State University for Year 4 and will graduate with a BSN degree upon completion of the program.

Admission Procedures

Students are admitted to the RIBN program (A10300S/A45110) in accordance with policies set by VGCC. Each applicant is required to meet the minimum admission eligibility requirements as set by the College. Meeting minimum eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission into the program, only an opportunity for consideration. Completion of the VGCC RIBN program does not guarantee success in passing the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX®).

The selection process for this program includes: Application to VGCC, PROGRAM APPLICATION Completion (must be completed for consideration for the Associate Degree Nursing Program), Points Allocation, and Acceptance Status. Regulations, procedures, and course requirements are subject to change as necessary and without prior notice.

NOTE: This program is offered at the Main Campus in Henderson. Students may be required to travel to NC A&T State University in Greensboro while enrolled in the RIBN program.

Admission Requirements

- 1. NC A&T Requirements:
 - a. Completion of the SAT or ACT.
 - i. A composite score of 1010 or higher is required for the SAT.
 - ii. A composite score of 20 or higher is required for the ACT.
 - b. High school unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher is required.





- i. Official test scores and high school transcripts are required to be sent to NC A&T University.
- 2. VGCC Requirements:
 - a. Completion of TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) with a score of 58% or higher.
 - b. Cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
 - c. Completion of the program application by March 31st, 2025.
 - i. Application to NC A&T will be completed after being notified of acceptance into the RIBN program at VGCC.





If you have met all of the requirements, then you are eligible to apply to the Fall 2025 VGCC RIBN Program! Let's get started!

Steps for Application

- 1. Apply to VGCC. Designate RIBN/ADN as the desired program of study. **Deadline for application to VGCC for Fall Admission to the RIBN Program is by 3 p.m. in person or by 11:59 p.m. online on March 31st.** Applicants will be placed into a Pre-Health Curriculum (Associate in General Education-General Science A10300S), until selected into the program.
 - a. Test scores or developmental coursework must be completed within five years of the program application deadline. Students must meet the VGCC admission requirements for College Ready in English and DMA-010 DMA-050 in order to be considered for the RIBN program.
- 2. Meet with the nursing advisor to complete the program application. The following is required as a part of the program application:

Selection Process

Admission to the Nursing Programs is competitive and based on a points system. Points are awarded based on a variety of factors, including certificates, degrees, course completion grades, and other academic achievements.

To be considered for ranking purposes, courses must be completed before the application deadline. Certifications, licensures, or residency status information must be submitted before the application deadline to be considered for ranking. *BIO courses must be within 10 years of the application date*. Nursing applicants are required to complete BIO-163 (PN applicants), BIO-168 & BIO-169 (ADN, LPN to ADN Transition and RIBN applicants), PSY-150 and ENG-111, prior to applying to the program.


